The initial goal of the committee was to determine if bringing back aeration on the lake would influence water clarity, weed control, and muck. The short answer is no, or at least not enough to merit the cost and maintenance.

The biggest problem our lake has is organic material, the muck. Organic material is added over the years via leaves, fertilizer, dead lake weeds, etc. Reducing the amount of organic material added to the lake each year is the most effective way to control the muck

In the committee's research they discovered there are other things we can be doing differently that will help with the water clarity, weed control, and muck. The committee continues to explore these avenues. I will report as we research and determine our future direction.

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The Covenants/Bylaws committee held their first meeting and will be preparing to make recommendations in the coming months. Their goal is to ensure our covenants are relative to the needs of our residents as well as protecting the property values of our lake community.
